Computer 101 for the Child Care Professional (Core of Knowledge—Professionalism)

Start Here! Learn the essentials of using a PC to become more efficient, organized and able to meet the new requirements for credentialing with MSDE Excels. Enhance your knowledge of file management and find out how to browse, open and rename a file. Practice creating new folders and copy and move files into these folders. Create a Gmail account from scratch and learn how to attach documents and pictures to an email. Explore the basics of Microsoft Word to create, edit and print out a document.
